Mixed Results For Stanford Golfers

It was a year of mixed results for the 1987 Stanford golf teams, as the men had a disappointing season while the women experienced a good deal of success.

The most consistent golfer for the men was sophomore Roger Miraglia, who played in the number one spot for part of the year and had the lowest Cardinal score at the Pacific Ten Championships. As a team, Stanford finished eighth in Pac-10 play and thus did not advance to the NCAA Tournament.

The women's team was once again headlined by senior Kathleen McCarthy, who was named an All-American for the third time in her four-year

career. McCarthy placed fifth overall at the Pac-10 Championships and ninth at the NCAA tournament, and also won the USIU Intercollegiate and Arizona Invitational tournaments.

Adrienne Gilmartin, Kay Cornelius, Trish McGonigle and Clare Dolan also contributed to the success of the team, which finished third in the Pac-10 and tenth in the NCAA Championships.

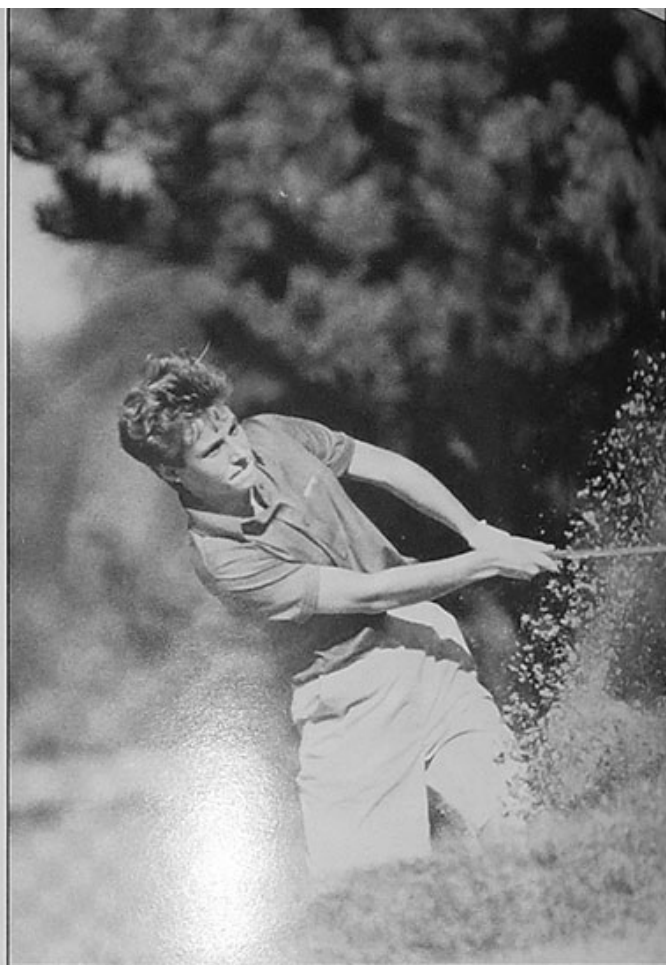
Though the women lose perhaps the finest female golfer in the school's history in McCarthy, both teams return a good number of their top players and should have strong seasons ahead of them.
